Libby Miller, Principal, AF Providence Middle School, shared her commitment to a strong spring despite her plans to depart at the end of the year.

School culture data is strong including attendance and very low out of school suspensions. Expeditions have been inspiring for scholars. The fifth grade participated proudly in the March for Our Lives and it was a defining moment for them as middle schoolers. The school did instruction and discussions that morning, and kids showed up with fantastic posters and led chants on Hartford Ave.

The adult team continues to be very strong.

Libby shared how much she's enjoyed working with Ashia Parks who will lead the school next year. Priorities are (1) staff retention and (2) student investment (increasing student voice, sense of fairness) for the 5th grade before the school doubles in size.

Sarah Blanton shared the reports from AF Providence Elementary and AF Iluminar Elementary Schools because both principals were attending a professional development opportunity. AF Iluminar Elementary continues to be very strong and has seen year over year academic gains.

B. Board Chair Report

The Professional Growth Plans (PGP) will be coming out in the spring and board members will have the opportunity to engage with the regional superintendents in the annual review of the returning principals.

The board had a discussion about how to positively impact the external narrative around charters as well as a discussion about the political landscape in RI.

C. Treasurer Report

Ben Smith gave the treasurer's report identifying the surpluses and deficits at the three schools.
