Our Charter Network Accelerator is an intensive cohort-based training program for CMO leaders (with a focus on leaders of color) who are looking to increase the number of top-quality options available to parents across the country; and through our Navigator Program, we provide coaching and support for district and charter schools who want to adopt and adapt our curriculum and instructional practices to help students achieve breakthrough results.

The Opportunity

Achievement First is seeking a self-motivated process-oriented DevOps Engineer to support our growing cloud technology stack. In addition, the engineer will work with other members of the data and full stack developers to install, maintain, and support the cloud web application and data infrastructure (AWS/Azure) required to meet the current and future needs of the Achievement First network. The engineer will provider Tier 1 and environment triage support to our development team. They will be responsible for ensuring that new features/options are implemented within our technology stack as they become available and create plans for reducing technical debt that has accumulated within the platforms themselves over the years. They will be entrusted to implement change as this role comes with the opportunity to part of a dynamic team that is creating the data infrastructure for our future tech needs.

Responsibilities of the Associate, DevOps Engineer will include but are not limited to:

- Build and maintain automation to provision cloud infrastructure
- Support other devops activities such as defining cloud configuration and CICD processes
- Plan and execute administrative activities (i.e., environment/database backups, system logging, alerting)
- Analyze the technology currently being used and develop plans/processes for improvement
- Work closely with developers to ensure application scale and deploy as anticipated
- Partner with network infrastructure team to address security issues (data breaches, account hijacking, application failures, etc.)
- Develop technical documentation: design diagrams, system functionality, data flow and interface specifications
- Work with Director of Network & Cloud infrastructure to plan and execute improvements to the cloud infrastructure environment
- Occasionally providing support off-hours and remotely when necessary

- Strong scripting skills using Python/PowerShell

- Minimum of 1-2 years of experience with a background in AWS or other cloud providers
- Experience with monitoring tools such as AWS CloudWatch, DataDog
- Excited by the prospect of optimizing an organization's cloud network infrastructure
- Passion for automation, quality, and lean/agile approach
- Can communicate well with others
- Are self-starting and can work independently
- Like to work with others as a team
- Team player possessing strong analytical as well as technical skills and can communicate the logic behind technical decisions.
- Ability to grasp new concepts quickly
